### April 2024




April was an active month for engagement! Our Ochil View Tenants Scrutiny Group assessed the values of Ochil View.


Our Scrutiny Group also gathered to deliberate on changes to the anti social behaviour policy and procedure.

#### June 2024



Bedford Place served as a tenant engagement initiative, where the Housing Team dedicated a morning to connect with residents. They worked together to create hanging baskets and spent time clearing and planting sleeds in a flower bed located in the back garden.







In June we asked tenants to submit project ideas to the value of £500 which was donated by Idverde our Landscape Maintenance Contractor to our Community Benefit Fund. We obtained over 30 applications with some great ideas and along with Idverde we picked two developments to benefit from this fund. The first was Steve Wallace's proposal for the Seed to a Plate project at Blairhall successfully securing £350. This funding was used to purchase essential items like topsoil, compost and gardening tools. From next year, tenants will be growing a broad range of vegetable. The second was to provide a bench at Old Mill Lane, Oakley which was an idea put forward from or one of our tenants in memory of her husband George.

# July 2024



In July, Ochil View collaborated with tenants, Clacks Council, Kingdom and Paragon for the Clackmannanshire Summer Carnival! This free event was a tremendous success, providing tenants with a delightful experience filled with food, drinks, face painting, book swaps, competitions and much more!






### December 2024
